## **Current Research Projects**

#### 2013-present Co-principal investigator

Trauma, Stress, & Resilience among Refugee and Immigrant Women & Families Using a community-based participatory research (CBPR) approach, this project explores the experiences, needs, and strengths of women and families from refugee and immigrant communities. We are utilizing qualitative and quantitative data sources to understand the impact of trauma and ongoing stressors, as well as the development of resilience. We have developed community advisory boards to undertake research and action steps in partnership with community members.

### 2014-present Co-principal investigator

Mindfulness-Based Compassion Training: Empathy & Decreasing Bias
This project focuses on the development and assessment of a brief mindfulness-based compassion intervention. Our research explores participant's experiences mindfulness-based compassion practices, barriers to ongoing practice, and both state and trait mindfulness. We assess the potential for this training to promote empathy, which is a promising pathway for reducing bias and increasing culturally appropriate counseling practice.

Mindfulness and Wellbeing among Social Justice Activists

Using qualitative and quantitative data, we explore what factors may mitigate or increase social justice activists' wellbeing. We examine participants' social and demographic factors, as well as engagement in and satisfaction with mindfulness practices. This work has led to the development of a new scale for social justice activists: the Activist Fatigue and Flourishing Inventory (AFFI).
