<u>Course Description:</u> This course is a survey of modern Chinese history from the seventeenth to the midtwentieth centuries (1600-1950s). The course will explore the momentous changes in the relationship between state and society from the founding of the Qing dynasty to the founding of the People's Republic of China (PRC). Themes to be covered include imperialism, nationalism, ethnicity & race, gender, and revolution (political, social, and cultural) during these three and a half centuries of Chinese history.

Requirements & Grading: You must complete (that is, demonstrate serious engagement with) <u>every</u> requirement in order to receive a passing grade. The instructor reserves the final right to determine what constitutes "completion" of a requirement.

- **1. Participation (25%):** I expect you to attend every one of our scheduled meetings and to be fully prepared. This means finishing the assigned readings listed for that day <u>before</u> coming to class. The quality of your written and oral contributions <u>both in class and online</u> will be considered as indicators of your participation and engagement.
- 2. In-class Map Quiz (5%): see 2nd map in front of Search for Modern China (3rd ed., 2013) W 9/3/2014.
- 3. Papers (45%): In order to hone your critical reading & writing skills, you will be asked to complete three (3) short (5-6 pg.) papers due in-class on Mon. 9/15/2014, Mon. 10/20/2014, & Mon. 11/10/2014. More detailed instructions will be provided in class. Guidelines and procedures for the submission of written work are listed below (see Course Policies, points d and e).
- 4. Take-Home Final Examination (25%): essays; due in my departmental mailbox (Robinson B, Room 359) by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Monday 12/8/2014. No late work will be accepted for the final exam.

Course Policies, Reminders, and Helpful Tips

a) Class absences: Students are expected to attend all meetings of the course. In the event that you must miss class, you are responsible for the contents of the lecture or discussion. **Students are expected to come to class on time.** Late arrivals are disruptive, and late-comers may miss important information or hand-outs.

Your name should be on the paper, and all pages should be stapled and numbered. *You must* <u>submit your work in hard copy only; no email attachments will accepted</u> (unless prior arrangements with the instructor have been made). You should, however, retain electronic copies of all written work, and your instructor may ask for an electronic copy of your paper in order to use it as an example in teaching or to submit to a plagiarism detection site like Turnitin.com.
- e) Late policy: All students are responsible for knowing and adhering to the deadlines for course assignments. Late work will be penalized ONE FULL LETTER GRADE (10 pts.) per day (including weekends & holidays). The only exceptions will be when you have explicit, advance permission from your instructor. If you anticipate a problem in completing or submitting your work on time, you must contact the instructor in a timely manner. If you do not hear back from your instructor, you should assume that your work is due on the original date. Regardless of whether or not you have been granted an extension, you must contact your instructor for how to submit late work.
