Course Description (GMU Course Catalog):

Analyzes ethical principles relevant for those working in criminal justice.

I. Learning Goal (Text Book Overview)

By the end of the course, students will develop the ethical decision-making skills that are essential in the field of criminal justice.

The text ETHICAL DILEMMAS AND DECISIONS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE, 9th Edition is packed with current, real-world examples that cover ethics across all three arms of the criminal justice system: the police, the courts, and corrections. It combines coverage of the philosophical principles and theories that are the foundation of ethical decision-making with the latest challenges and issues in criminal justice -- militarization of the police, mass imprisonment, wrongful convictions, the misuse of power by public servants, and more.

Course Requirements and Grading

- 20% Chapter Assignments Assignments will be completed on Blackboard using the MindTap subscription-based learning service. This entails weekly take-home quizzes, video reviews and scenario based questions.
- 20% Mid-Term Exam
- 20% A five (5) page, double spaced, paper on a topic approved by the instructor. The paper should use class readings and discussion to form a defensible position on the selected topic. In addition to the assigned text, students are required to cite at least three different sources. Papers will be written using the APA formatting and style guide (http://writingcenter.gmu.edu/writing-resources/helpful-links).
- 20% Final Exam
- 20% Participation includes attendance, class participation and opinion essay/responses on the Blackboard Discussion Board.
