Description

Humanities College to Career is a one-credit course designed to prepare humanities majors to transition to post-graduation employment.

NACE Competencies

Humanities College to Career prepares students to understand and achieve NACE competencies.

The National Association of Colleges and Employers, based on extensive research among employers, has identified eight competencies associated with career readiness:

- 1. Critical Thinking/Problem Solving
- 2. Oral/Written Communication
- 3. Teamwork/Collaboration
- 4. Digital Technology
- 5. Leadership
- 6. Professionalism/Work Ethic
- 7. Career Management
- 8. Global/Intercultural Fluency

Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, you will know how to and be able to

- ♦ identify distinctive, marketable skills gained from your humanities degree at George Mason University
- ♦ write a customized, professional resume and cover letter
- prepare a personal pitch and recite it to potential employers
- interview competently using the STAR method
- ♦ build a LinkedIn page to network with others in your field, including GMU alum
- ♦ create a career plan based on employer research and your own skills, experiences, and SMART goals
- ♦ demonstrate the NACE eight competencies of career readiness



Course Requirements & Grading

1. Attendance and Participation (30 points)

2. Resume (15 points)

• Draft, revise, and finalize a professional resume. Instructors and peers will provide feedback for your revisions.

3. Career Fair Analysis (15 points)

• Write an analysis of your employer research to prepare for the Career Fair and of your interactions at the Career Fair.

4. Interview Stream (10 points)

• Answer two interview questions, and then assess your communication skills.

5. LinkedIn Profile (10 points)

• Create or improve a LinkedIn profile; peer and instructor feedback will be provided

6. Career Portfolio (20 points)

Complete a career development plan and cover letter based on a job posting.
