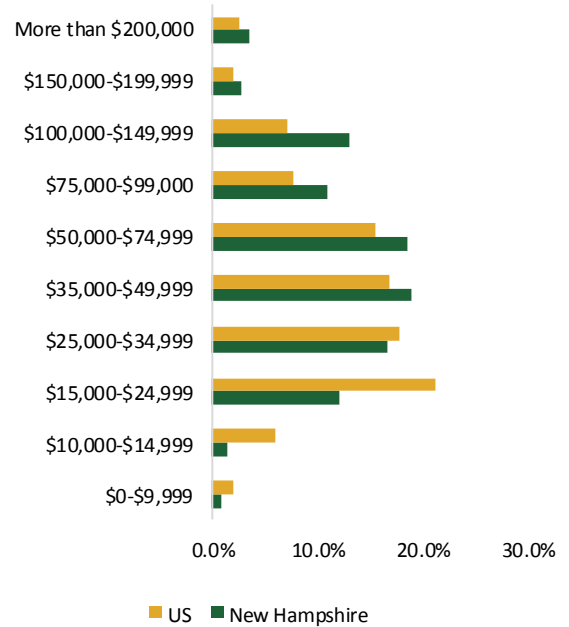
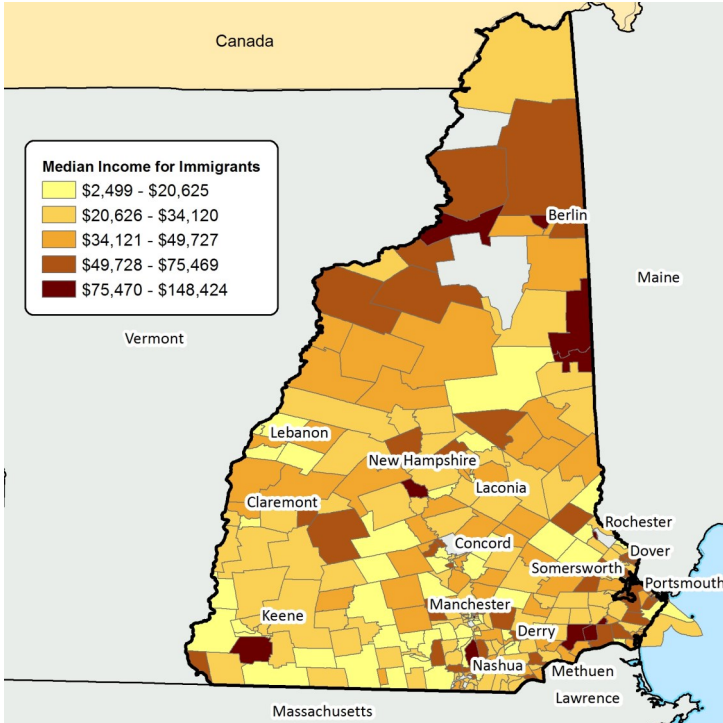

Income of Foreign-Born Residents in New Hampshire and the U.S.



Median income varies for immigrants across New Hampshire, generally median income increases as you travel southeast toward the Sea Coast Region. Generally, New Hampshire immigrants make more than the national averages. The income levels for immigrants in New Hampshire is higher than the national average after \$35,000. The educational attainment of the immigrant community is also relatively high at above 36 percent having at least a Bachelor’s Degree.

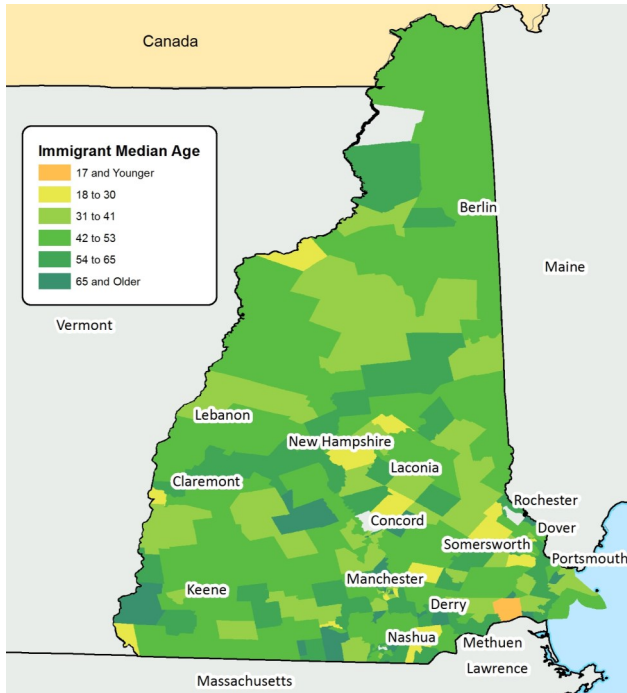

Median Age for Immigrant Communities

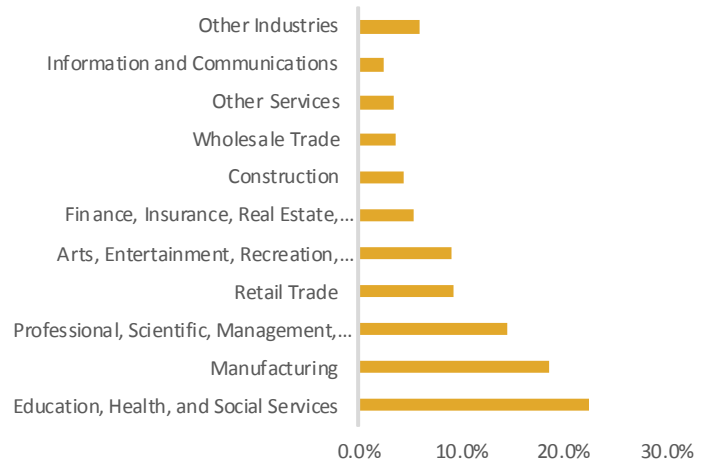
