POLICIES

Transfer of Credit

Students who have prior graduate course work that has not been applied to another degree may request to have a maximum of 12 of these graduate credits transferred to their degree program, with approval of the Graduate Director and Dean and in accordance with the Graduate Policies section of the *Catalog*.

Reduction of Credits

Students entering the master's program with a previously conferred graduate degree in a related discipline may request that the required credits for the MS degree be reduced by a maximum of 12 credits with approval of the Graduate Director and Dean and in accordance with the Graduate Policies section of the *Catalog*.

Satisfactory Progress

Students who fail to make satisfactory progress may be terminated from the program. Satisfactory progress in the MS in Criminal Justice is defined as maintaining a minimum GPA of 3.00 with the minimum grade of B- in all courses. Students who receive a grade below B- will receive an academic warning the first time and a letter of termination the second time.
