Self-Place Guidelines for German Courses

- 1. Are you able to introduce yourself saying your name, where you are from, what you study, what your hobbies are and what you like to eat?
- 2. Can you describe your family?
- 3. Can you form simple sentences with direct and indirect objects?
- 4. Are you able to formulate questions?
- 5. Can you address your conversation partner using formal *Sie* and informal *du*?
- 6. Are you able to form simple sentences in the past tense (*Perfekt*)?

If you can answer "yes" to all of the above questions but cannot answer 7,8,9,10,11,12, you can enroll in Germ 201. If you cannot answer "yes" to some or all of the above questions 1-6, please enroll in Germ 110.

- 7. Can you produce a simple narrative in the simple past (*Präteritum*)?
- 8. Are you familiar with all four cases and how they convey meaning?
- 9. Are you able to describe your living conditions and travel experiences using complex sentences?

If you can answer "yes" to all of the above questions, but cannot answer the questions 10,11 and 12, you can enroll in Germ 202.

- 10. Can you write your resume in German?
- 11. Are you able to introduce yourself formally in a German job interview?
- 12. Can you produce a narrative using the present, past and future tenses in complex sentences?

If you can answer "yes" to all questions 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12, you can opt out of Germ 202.
