National Science Foundation BioSketch and Current and Pending Procedures implementing
Proposal and Award Policies Guide (PAPPG) NSP 20-2
EFFECTIVE: MAY 18, 2020

Background:

- On January 24, 2020, NSG released its updated [Proposal & Award Policies & Procedures Guide](#) (PAPPG) (NSF 20-1) announcing new required NSF-approved formats for the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending Support, EFFECTIVE JUNE 1, 2020.
- Although use of an NSF-approved format for submission is not required until implementation of the revised PAPPG (NSF 20-1) on June 1, 2020, NSF is encouraging proposers to begin using the NSF-approved formats as soon as possible
- Starting June 1, NSF will **REJECT** applications where the Biosketch and Current and Pending do not use the new format.

Mason Implementation – May 18, 2020:

- In following NSF's recommendation to begin using the new forms prior to June 1 to ensure PI's understand the process to generate biosketches and Current and Pending forms in SciENcv, and to test uploading with compliance checks,
- **OSP will require PI's to use SciENcv beginning May 18, 2020.**

NSF-approved Format: **SciENcv**:

- NSF has partnered with the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to use [SciENcv: Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae](#) as an NSF-approved format for use in preparation of both the Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending Support sections of an NSF proposal.
- Additional information about the NSF-approved SciENcv formats is available on the NSF [biographical sketch](#) and [current and pending support](#) websites.

- The SciENcv tool integrates with NIH's ORCID, enabling proposers to populate their Biographical Sketches by importing data directly from their ORCID records rather than having to manually enter all the required information. ORCID is the Open Researcher and Contributor ID and is used within NIH and Grants.gov to relate publications to grants. If you do not have ORCID, the system also links to PubMed.
- Biographical Sketch data maintained in SciENcv can be quickly and easily updated on an ongoing basis for subsequent proposal submissions.
- PIs may assign delegates in SciENcv to create and update profiles on their behalf. Please note, OSP staff will not serve in the delegate role.

If you cannot use SciENcv:

- There is an alternate NSF Fillable PDF. **HOWEVER, OSP STRONGLY RECOMMENDS YOU USE SciENcv**
- Otherwise, the PI must download the respective fillable PDF form from the NSF [biographical sketch](#) and [current and pending support](#) websites and complete. NSF has advised that a new fillable PDF must be created for each application.
- PI's OR THEIR ASSIGNED DELEGATE WILL NEED TO COPY AND PASTE ALL INFORMATION FROM PREVIOUS BIOSKETCH and CURRENT AND PENDING AND UPDATE AS APPROPRIATE. THE FILLABLE PDF HAS MULTIPLE COLUMNS AND THE DATA IS NOT EASILY PASTED AND FORMATTED. OSP ENCOURAGES PIs TO USE SciENcv.
- OSP is not able to assist due to the time required to copy and paste information into the fillable PDF.
