

So what classes should I take??

Don't worry, **History majors have lots of choices!** First, to make things easy, we suggest you try following the Semester 1 chart below, taken from the sample schedule History B.A. degree map:

Freshman Year (Semester 1)	Credits
HIST 100 or 125	3
English 101 (100)	3
Natural Science (non-lab)	3
Foreign Language	6
Total	15

Freshman Year (Semester 2)	Credits
Literature	3
Oral Communication	3
Global Understanding (HIST)	3
Natural Science (w/lab)	4

But maybe you expect to test out of part or all of foreign language, or you expect to have AP or IB credit for HIST 100 or English 101, or you aren't really so keen on science and don't want to lead with it in your first semester? No problem! Just borrow something from Semester 2. For example, you could take COMM 100 or 101 for **Oral Communication** or a 200-level History class for **Global Understanding**. If you've already got credit for English 101 or 100, you could take a **Literature** requirement course such as ENGH 201.

Still don't have enough options? Borrow from one of the later semesters and take something to fulfill one of these requirements:

Math (most students take MATH 106)

Arts (lots of choices, including Art History – aka ARTH – in our department)

Philosophy/Religious Studies (try PHIL 100 or RELI 100)

Just remember that any time you're going to fulfill a requirement for Mason Core or CHSS (College of Humanities and Social Sciences), you need to make sure the course you take is on the approved list. Use the list of Core classes offered in the upcoming semester to choose approved class options. If the list says a class has prerequisites, look up the course at <http://catalog.gmu.edu> to see if you've met the prereqs through exam credit or dual enrollment.

When it's time to go to the registration site, make sure you bring 3 or more draft lists of courses you could take in case a 1st or 2nd choice course is full or conflicts with something else on your schedule! See schedule planner on reverse side.

***Full-time undergraduate tuition covers 12-15 semester credits. Semester credits beyond 15 are charged at the per-credit rate. This sample semester includes 16-credits but other plans can be developed. Please see your advisor.**
