



Figure 2. Citizenship Status


Foreign-Born Individuals in the DC and Baltimore Metro Areas

Foreign-Born Individuals, age 5+, in the DC and Baltimore Metro





*Please note that the terms "immigrant" and "foreign born" are used interchangeably throughout this fact sheet. Foreign born refers to individuals who are not a U.S. citizen at birth or who were born outside the U.S., Puerto Rico or other U.S. territories and whose parents are not U.S. citizens. The foreign born may include naturalized U.S. citizens, Legal Permanent Residents, temporary residents, refugees and asylees, and others. Additionally, native born includes those who are U.S. citizens at birth, those born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or other U.S. territories, and those born abroad to a parent who is a U.S. citizen.




Education, Income, Health Insurance, and Housing

56% of foreign born from El Salvador living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas have health insurance coverage compared to 82% of all other foreign born and 95% of native-born U.S. citizens.

☐ Bacherlor's Degree



Figure 5. Median Total Family Income and Personal Earned Income













Foreign born from El Salvador are less likely to work in STEM or STEM-related occupations compared to all other immigrants and native born but much more likely to work in important occupations such as construction, building, and grounds cleaning and maintenance, food preparation and serving, transportation and material moving, and sales compared to all other foreign born and native born in the DC and Baltimore metro areas.


Figure 8. Employment in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) Occupations





Figure 10. Salvadoran Immigrant Population in the United States, 1950-2017



Foreign-Born Salvadorians as a Percentage of Total Foreign Born Population in the United States

- \$33,000:*Median personal income of Salvadoran immigrants who are selfemployed and living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas
- \$41,367:* Median personal income of all other foreign born who are self-employed and living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas
- \$62,125:* Median personal income of native-born U.S. citizens who are self-employed and living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas
