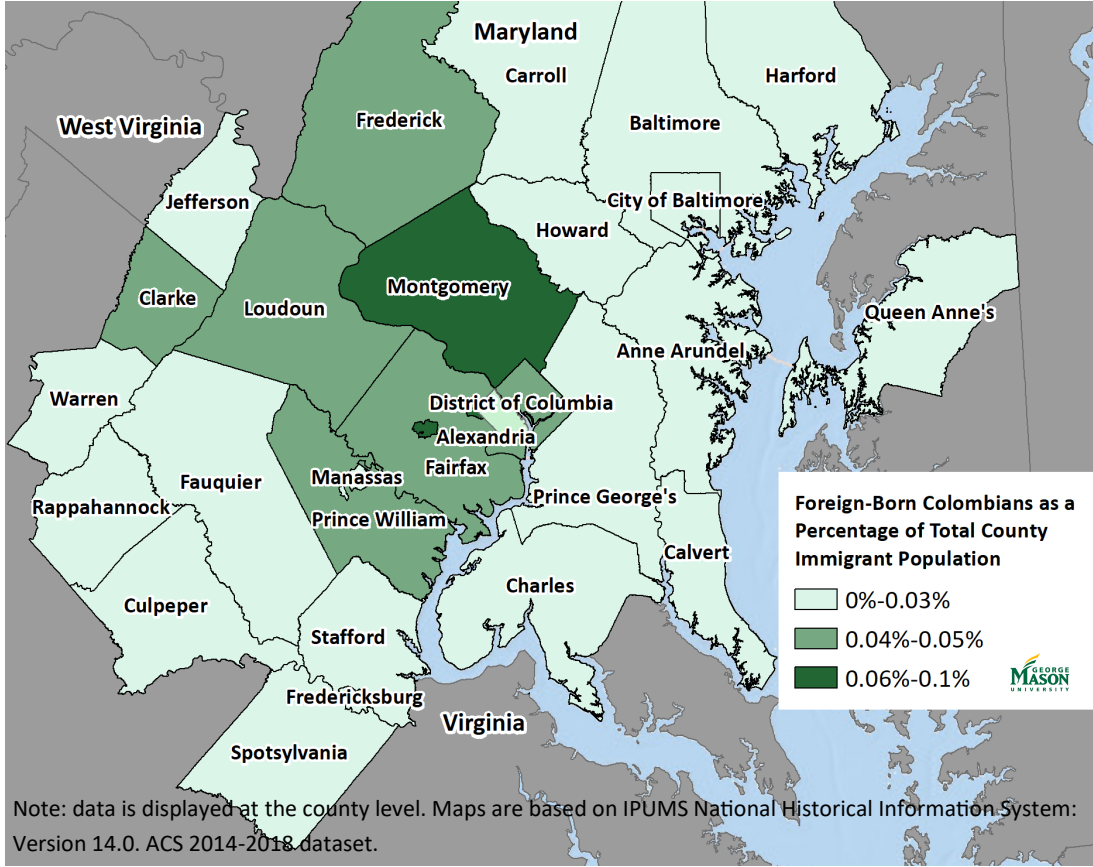

NUMBERS AT A GLANCE

- **22,600:** Estimated number of Colombian immigrants* living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas (**1%** of the area's immigrant population). Among them:
 - **43% Male and 57% Female**
 - **16 years:** Median years in the U.S.
 - **45:** Median age
 - **48% Eligible to vote** (naturalized U.S. citizens age 18+)

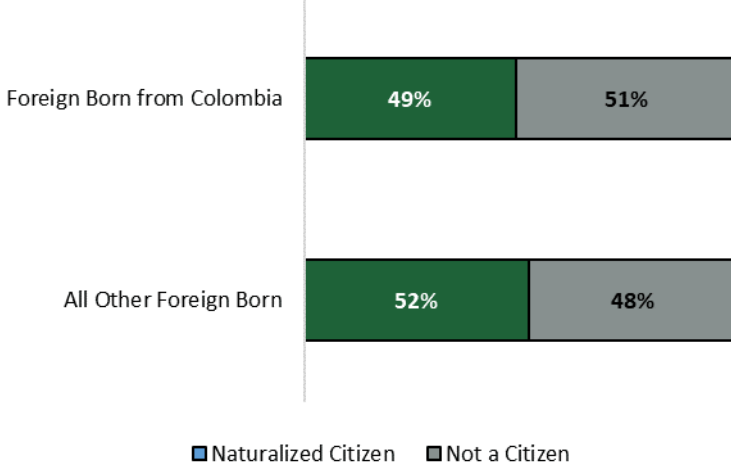
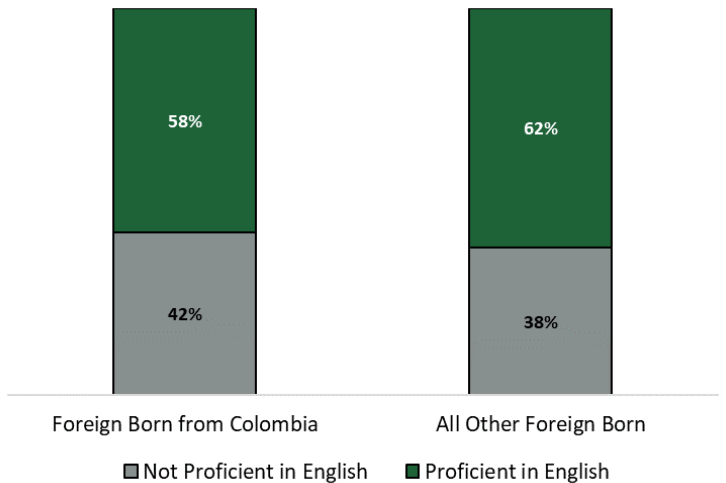


Figure 3. English Proficiency

*Please note that the terms "immigrant" and "foreign born" are used interchangeably throughout this fact sheet. Foreign born refers to individuals who are not a U.S. citizen at birth or who were born outside the U.S., Puerto Rico or other U.S. territories and whose parents are not U.S. citizens. The foreign born may include naturalized U.S. citizens, Legal Permanent Residents, temporary residents, refugees and asylees, and others. Additionally, native born includes those who are U.S. citizens at birth, those born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or other U.S. territories, and those born abroad to a parent who is a U.S. citizen.

Education, Income, Health Insurance, and Housing



86% of foreign born from Colombia living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas have health insurance coverage compared to **80%** of all other foreign born and **96%** of native-born U.S. citizens.

Individuals, age 25+, in the DC and Baltimore Metro Areas

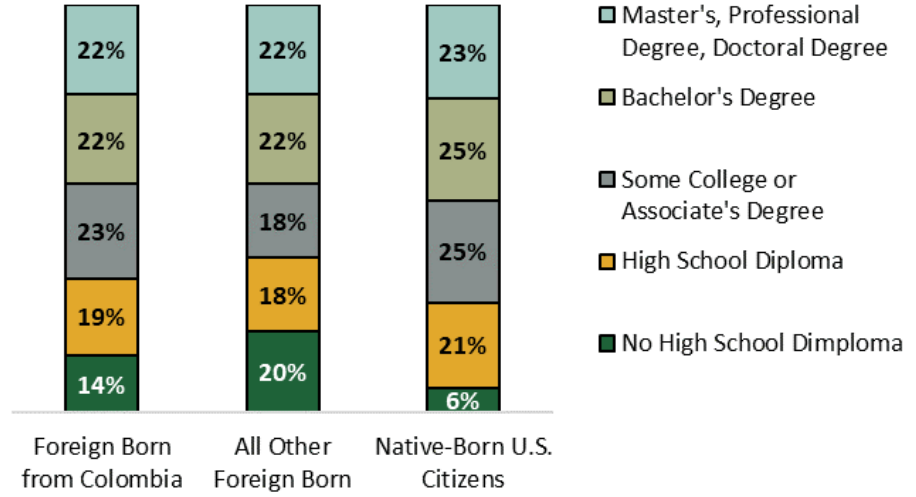
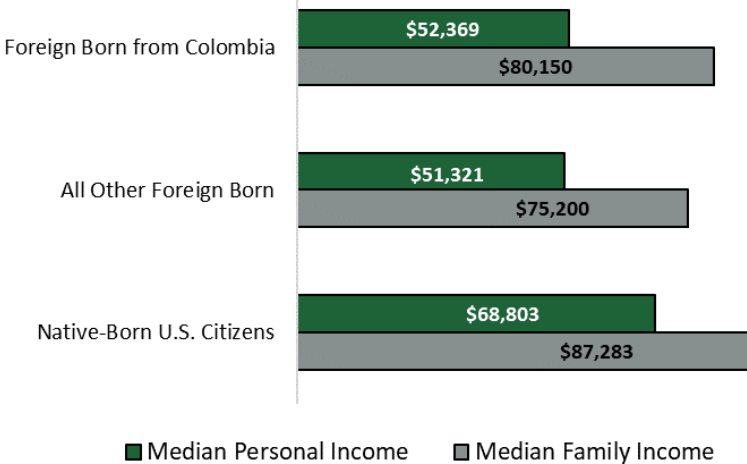


Figure 5. Median Total Family Income and Personal Earned Income

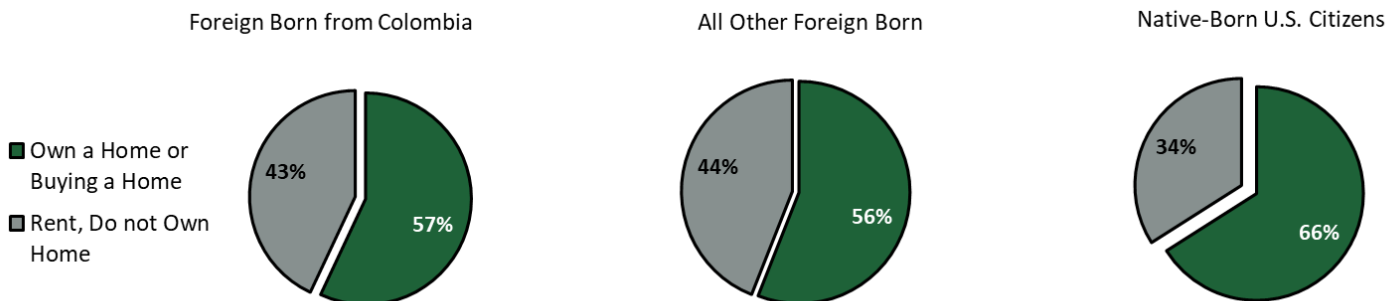
Individuals who are employed full-time, age 16-65, in the DC and Baltimore Metro Areas



10% of the Colombian immigrants in the DC and Baltimore metro areas are living below the poverty line compared to **9%** of all other foreign born and **9%** of native-born U.S. citizens.

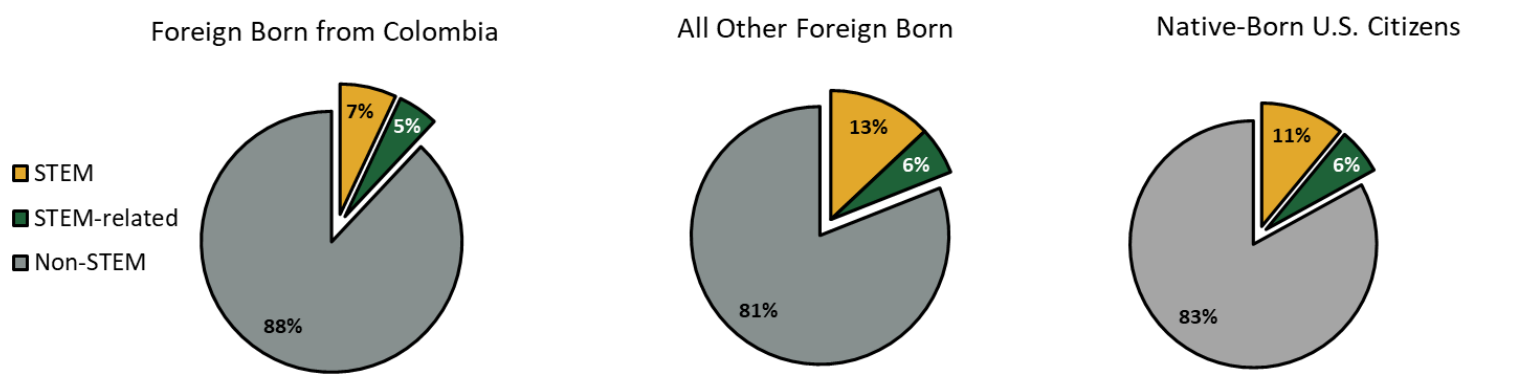

In 2018, foreign born from Colombia in the labor force have the same unemployment rates (5%) compared to all other foreign born (5%) and native born (5%) living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas.

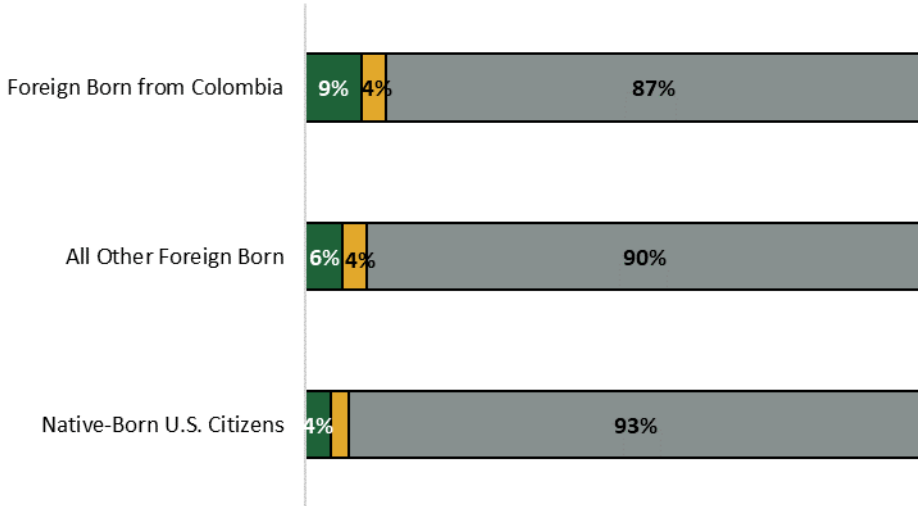

 ■ Works for wages or salary

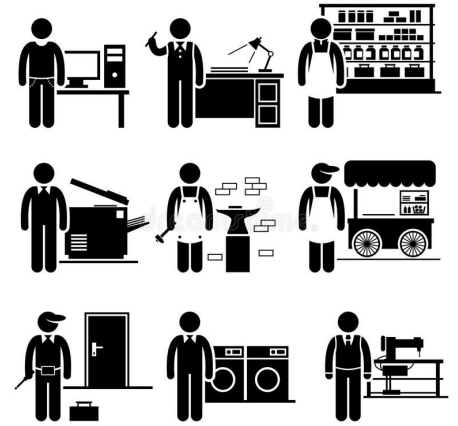
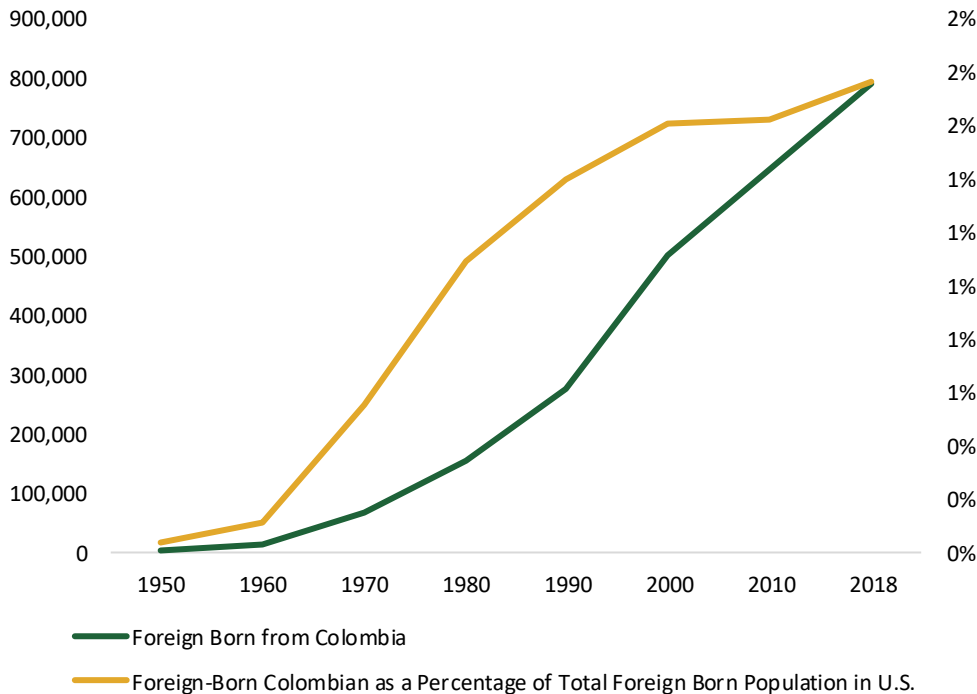


Figure 10. Colombian Immigrant Population in the United States, 1950-2018

- **\$68,769:*** Median personal income of native-born U.S. citizens who are self-employed and living in the DC and Baltimore metro areas
