#### **Bachelor of Arts in Economics (BA)**

- Strong interest in a broad education in the liberal arts tradition. Additional foreign language requirements.
- Appropriate for students pursuing careers valuing critical thinking skills.
- Popular among students interested in law school or less-quantitative graduate programs in business or public administration.

#### **Bachelor of Science in Economics (BS)**

- Stronger emphasis on quantitative analysis.
- Appropriate for career as government analyst, consulting, trade associations, or other private sector positions that require quantitative skills.
- Best preparation for graduate school in economics or more quantitative business administration programs.

#### **Optional Concentrations**

- Managerial Economics: explores how economics is applied to strategic decisions in business. (Only available within the BS degree.)
- **Philosophy, Politics, and Economics (PPE):** mixes economics with coursework in philosophy and political science. (Available within both the BA and BS degrees.)
