

Distribution of Immigrants

Figure 1 shows where immigrants from select Asian countries live in the Washington -Arlington-Alexandria metro area. Loudoun County (34%), Fredericksburg City (26%) and Fairfax County (20%) reported the highest percentages of immigrants from select Asian countries.

2019 NUMBERS AT A GLANCE

- 44,032,500: Approximate number of immigrants living in the U.S. (14% of the population)
- 1,408,300: Approximate number of immigrants living in the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria Metro Area (23% of the metro's population)
- 202,100: Approximate number of immigrants from select Asian countries living in the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria Metro Area (14% of the metro's immigrant population)
- 44%: Estimated increase in the number of immigrants from select Asian countries living in the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria Metro Area in the past 10 years
- 19th: Rank of the metro area among the 260 identified metro areas in terms of immigrants as a percentage of the metro's population

¹Please note that the terms "immigrant" and "foreign born" are used interchangeably throughout this fact sheet. Foreign born refers to individuals who are not a U.S. citizen at birth or who were born outside the U.S., Puerto Rico or other U.S. territories and whose parents are not U.S. citizens. The foreign born may include naturalized U.S. citizens, Legal Permanent Residents, temporary residents, refugees and asylees, and others. Additionally, native born includes those who are U.S. citizens at birth, those born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or other U.S. territories, and those born abroad to a parent who is a U.S. citizen.

²Select Asian countries in the fact sheet include Afghanistan, India, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Burma (Myanmar), Pakistan, Sri Lanka (Ceylon), Iran, and Nepal.



Figure 2 shows that more than half of the immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area came from India. Nearly one out of four immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area came from Pakistan or Iran.

Figure 3. Employment Rates Immigrants from Select Asian Countries






Employment Rates

Figure 3 indicates that immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area reported slightly higher employment rates compared to all other residents in the DC metro area.

Gender Distribution


Figure 4 shows that immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area are slightly more likely to be male compared to all other residents in the DC metro area.

Figure 5. Age Distribution Among Immigrants from Select Asian Countries




Age Distribution

Figure 5 shows that immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area tend to be older than all other residents in the DC metro. Immigrants from select Asian countries in the DC metro are much more likely to be 35 years old or older (69%) compared to all other residents in the DC metro area (53%). The median age of immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro is 42, while the median age of all other residents in the DC metro is 36.

Family Income

Figure 6 shows that immigrant-headed households from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area are more likely to earn \$75,000 or above (69%) than all other residents in the DC metro (58%). Immigrant-headed households from select Asian countries in the DC metro are less likely to earn \$40,000 or less (15%) compared to all other residents in the DC metro (21%). The median household income of immigrant-headed households from select Asian countries living in the DC metro is \$115,060, while the median household income of all other residents in the DC metro is \$90,000.


²A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit. A native-born U.S. citizen household is defined as a household which is headed by a native-born U.S. citizen, regardless of the immigration status of the spouse. Conversely, an immigrant headed household is defined as a household which is headed by a foreign-born individual, regardless of the immigration status of the spouse. With regard to income, the total family income is used. This includes the total annual income of all family members in the household.

Figure 7 shows that immigrant-headed households from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area are much more likely to have one or more children (60%) compared to all other residents in the DC metro (41%).

Figure 8 shows that immigrants from select Asian countries living in the DC metro area are more likely to be married (80%) compared to all other residents in the DC metro area (56%).
