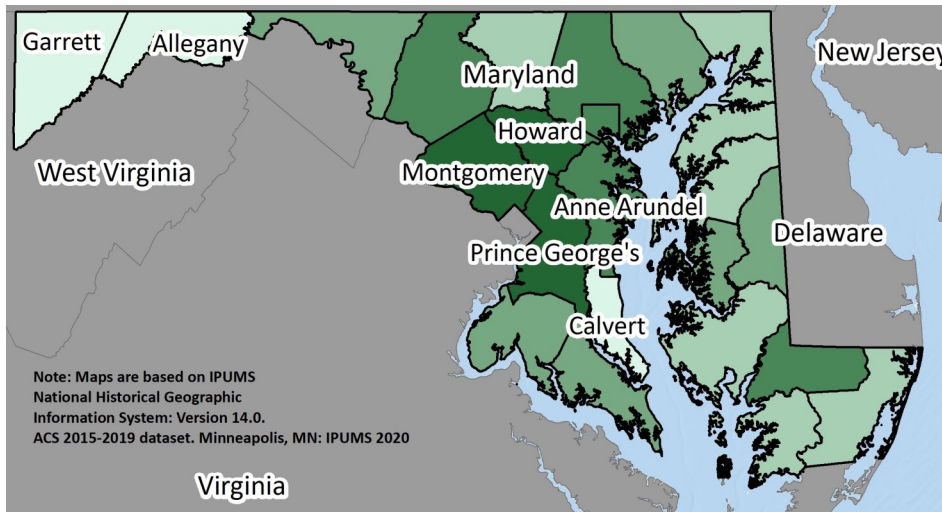
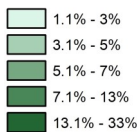


Immigrants in Anne Arundel County, MD

2019 NUMBERS AT A GLANCE

- **44,032,500:** Approximate number of immigrants¹ living in the U.S. (14% of the population)
- **911,300:** Approximate number of immigrants living in Maryland (15% of the state's population)
- **48,400:** Approximate number of immigrants living in Anne Arundel County, MD (8% of the county's population)
- **31%:** Estimated Increase in the number of immigrants living in Anne Arundel County, MD over the past 10 years.
- **9th:** Rank of Maryland among the 50 states and the District of Columbia in terms of immigrants as a percentage of the state's total population.

Distribution of Immigrants in Maryland State

Figure 1 shows where immigrants live in Maryland as a percentage of the county's population. Montgomery (32 percent), Prince George's (23 percent), and Howard (21 percent) Counties reported the highest percentages of immigrants in this state. Garrett, Allegany, and Calvert Counties reported the lowest percentages of immigrants in the state with all of them having less than 3 percent.

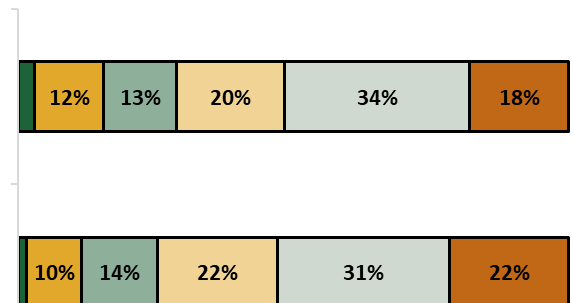
Year of Immigration

Figure 2 shows that foreign-born individuals living in Anne Arundel County, MD are slightly more likely to have arrived to the United States before 2000 (48 percent) than in the rest of Maryland (47 percent). However, in both Anne Arundel County, MD as well as in the rest of the State of Maryland the median year of arrival to the United States for foreign-born individuals is the year 2000.

¹Please note that the terms "immigrant" and "foreign born" are used interchangeably throughout this fact sheet. Foreign born refers to individuals who are not a U.S. citizen at birth or who were born outside the U.S., Puerto Rico or other U.S. territories and whose parents are not U.S. citizens. The foreign born may include naturalized U.S. citizens, Legal Permanent Residents, temporary residents, refugees and asylees, and others. Additionally, native born includes those who are U.S. citizens at birth, those born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or other U.S. territories, and those born abroad to a parent who is a U.S. citizen.

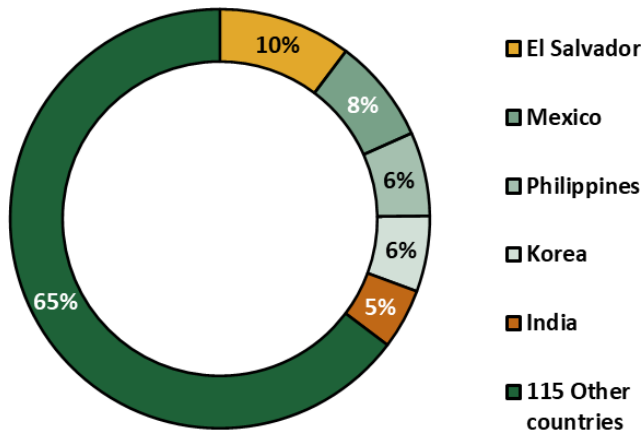

Country of Birth

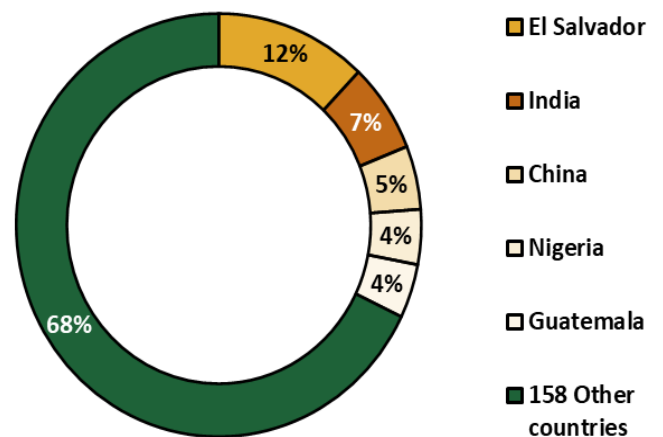
The largest share of immigrants in Anne Arundel County, MD were born in El Salvador (10 percent), which is also the top country of origin for foreign-born individuals in the rest of Maryland (12 percent). India is within the top five countries of origin for immigrants in both Anne Arundel County, MD (5 percent) and the rest of Maryland (7 percent). The top five countries of origin for immigrants in Anne Arundel County, MD are from Latin America (El Salvador and Mexico) and Asia (Philippines, Korea and India). In the rest of the State of Maryland the top five countries of origin for immigrants are also part of these two continents but there is also one country from Africa (Nigeria with 4 percent).

 **Figure 3. Top Five Country of Birth Among Immigrants**

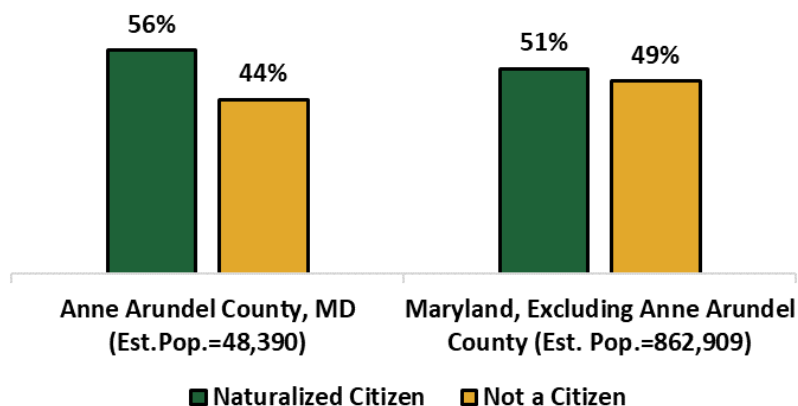

Figure 4 shows that foreign-born individuals in Anne Arundel County, MD are more likely to be naturalized citizens (56 percent) compared to all other immigrants in Maryland (51 percent).

English Proficiency

Figure 5 shows that immigrants in Anne Arundel County, MD, are more likely to be proficient in English (67 percent) than in the rest of Maryland (62 percent).

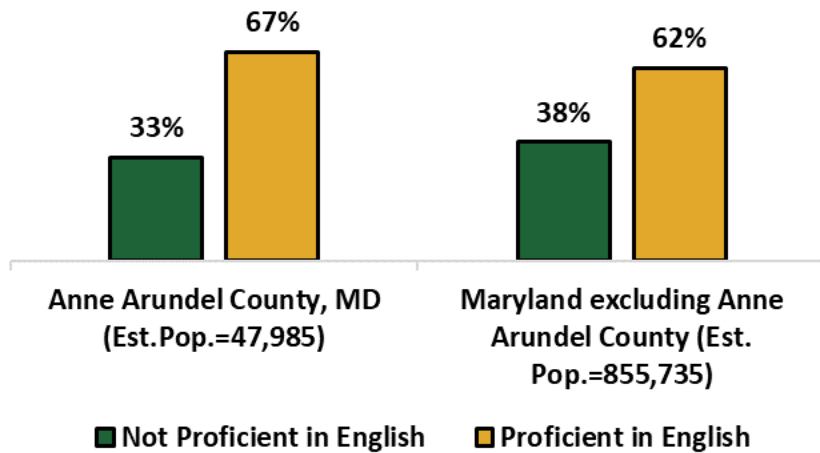
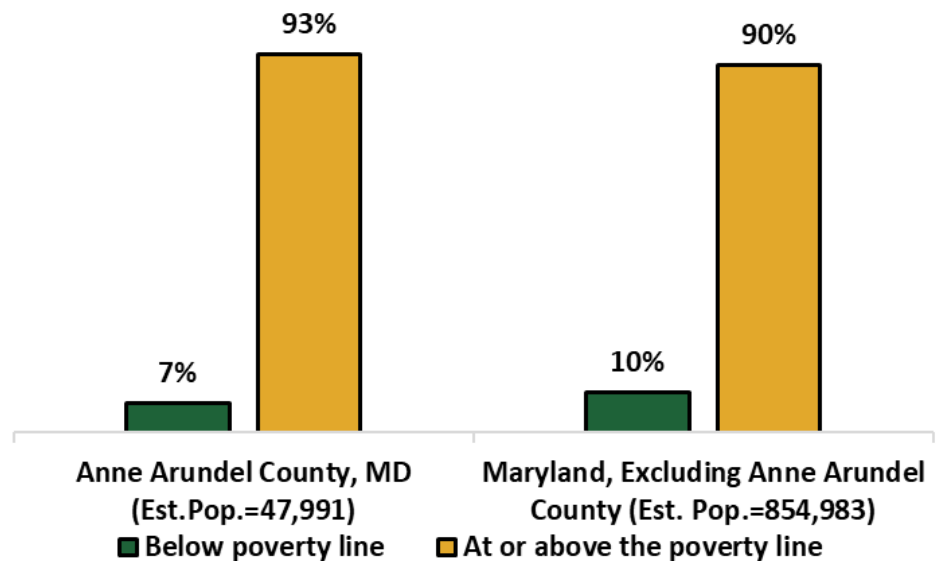


Figure 6. Poverty Status among Foreign-Born Individuals

Figure 6 shows that the foreign born in Anne Arundel County, MD are more likely to be above the poverty line (93 percent) than in the rest of Maryland (90 percent).
