Degree Notes

No more than two courses (six credits) conducted in English may be used to fulfill requirements for the concentration in Korean. All students must complete at least one course designated "writing intensive" in their majors at the 300 level or above. Students majoring in Foreign Languages-Korean, may fulfill this requirement by successfully completing KORE 370. Any remaining credits may be completed with elective courses to bring the degree total to 120 with 45 of these credits at the 300/400 level.
