To fulfill the Global Affairs foreign language requirement, students can continue the study of one language beyond the intermediate proficiency level required for all BA degrees in the college or choose to study other languages. Concentration (12 credits): Students choose twelve credits within one concentration; courses in a concentration must come from at least two different departments. ## Degree Notes

Grade of $C$ or better required for core courses and capstone; grade of C - or better required for language study courses and major concentration courses. All students must complete at least one course designated "writing intensive" in their majors at the 300 level or above. Students majoring in Global Affairs may fulfill this requirement by successfully completing EVPP 337. Any remaining credits may be completed with elective courses to bring the degree total to 120 with 45 of these credits at the 300/400 level.
