Students in the concentration in U.S. History are encouraged to take at least one course with a broadly global perspective such as HIST 394 Globalization and History. ## Degree Notes

All students must complete at least one course designated "writing intensive" in their majors at the 300 level or above. Students majoring in History may fulfill this requirement by successfully completing HIST 300 or 499. Any remaining credits may be completed with electives to bring degree total to 120 with 45 credits at the 300/400 level.
