OVERVIEW

The graduate certificate in teaching English as a second language (TESL) is an 18-credit hour program that focuses on the applied aspects of English linguistics. This program offers courses in phonetics, grammar, second language acquisition, teaching ESL, and a practicum. If you are not enrolled in a GMU program, be aware that only 6 credit hours of coursework taken before you enroll in this certificate program may be counted toward this certificate.

PLANNING YOUR COURSE OF STUDY

You must minimally complete 18 credit hours of coursework in this program.

You must minimally complete 33 credit hours if you are completing both the MA and the TESL certificate programs concurrently.

You must complete 36 credit hours if you were advised to take LING 520 and you are completing both the MA and the TESL certificate programs concurrently.
