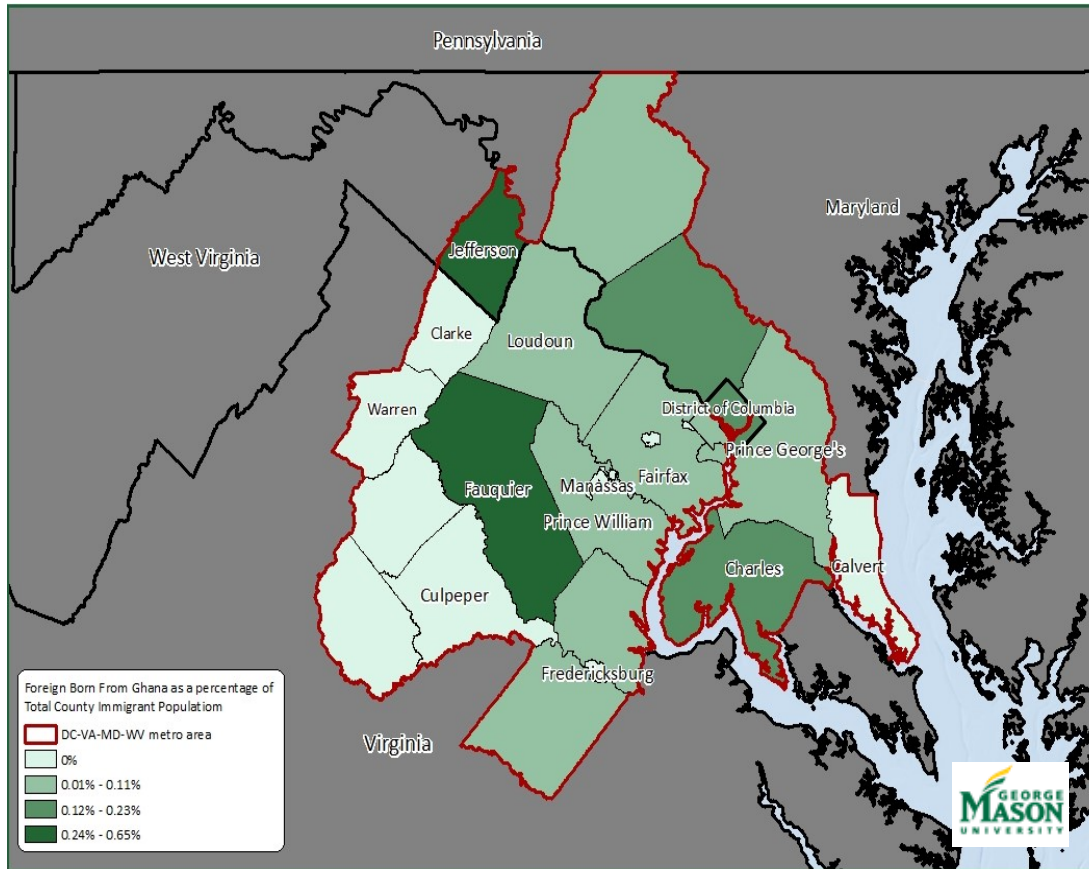

2020 NUMBERS AT A GLANCE

- **44,411,750:** Approximate number of immigrants living in the U.S. (14% of the population)
- **1,425,100:** Approximate number of immigrants in the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria Metro Area (23% of the metropolitan area population)
- **23,130:** Approximate number of Ghanaian immigrants in the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria Metro Area (2% of the metropolitan area's foreign-born population)

Distribution of Immigrants

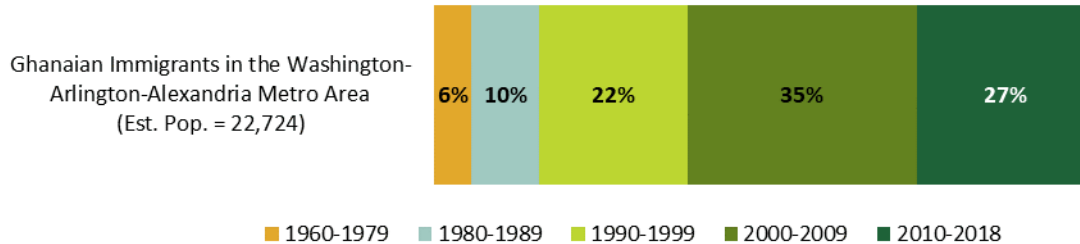
Figure 1 shows the distribution of Ghanaian immigrants, as a percentage of total foreign-born county population, throughout the Washington-Arlington-Alexandria, DC-VA-MD-WV metropolitan area (also referred to herein as the DMV metropolitan area). Within the DMV metropolitan area, as highlighted in red in Figure 1, the following counties comprise the top 5 counties for Ghanaian-born immigrants: Jefferson County, West Virginia (0.65%); Fauquier County, Virginia (0.64%); Washington D.C. (0.23%); Howard County, Maryland (0.22%); and Charles County, Maryland (0.19%). The counties with the lowest share of Ghanaian immigrants, as a portion of total Foreign-born population, are mostly Virginia counties reporting no, or liminal, Ghanaian born immigrants. These counties include Warren, Fairfax City, Falls Church City, Fredericksburg City, Manassas City, and Manassas Park.

All analysis in this fact sheet is based on source data from the U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey, 2016-2020 distributed through IPUMS-USA, University of Minnesota, www.ipums.org, unless otherwise noted.

Please note that the terms "immigrant" and "foreign born" are used interchangeably throughout this fact sheet. Foreign born refers to individuals who are not a U.S. citizen at birth or who were born outside the U.S., Puerto Rico or other U.S. territories and whose parents are not U.S. citizens. The foreign born may include naturalized U.S. citizens, Legal Permanent Residents, temporary residents, refugees and asylees, and others. Additionally, native born includes those who are U.S. citizens at birth, those born in the United States, Puerto Rico, or other U.S. territories, and those born abroad to a parent who is a U.S. citizen.

Year of Immigration

As shown in Figure 2 above, a majority of Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV Metro area migrated in 2000 or later (62%). This is similar to all other immigrants in the DMV metro area, 61% of whom migrated to the United States post 2000. The median year of arrival for Ghanaian immigrants is 2003 which is later than the median year of immigration for all other immigrants in the DMV Metro area (2000).

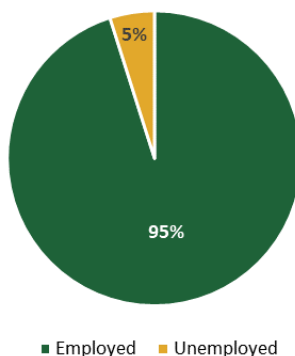
Age

The majority of Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV metropolitan area are between 35–64 years old (68%). Roughly 53% of all other immigrants in the DMV metro area are within this age range. Additionally, there are considerably fewer Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV ages 15 or under (2.2%) compared with all other immigrants in this area (5.2%). The median age of Ghanaian immigrants in area is 44, while the median age among all other immigrants in the DMV metro area is 43.

Employment Status

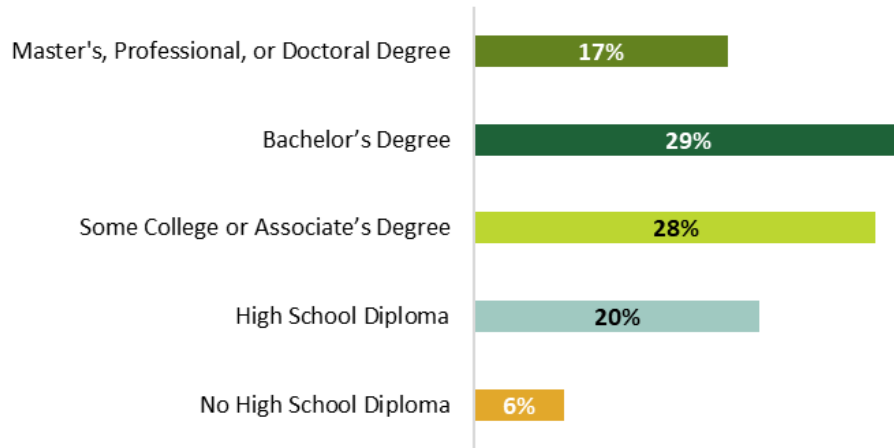
The vast majority of Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV metro area are employed (95%). For full time, employed Ghanaians in the DMV metro area between the ages of 16-65, 32% make less than \$40,000 a year, 39% make between \$40,000 and \$74,999, and 29% make \$75,000 or greater. The median income among Ghanaian-born immigrants in this area is \$53,933. Additionally, roughly 8% of Ghanaian immigrants between the ages of 16 and 65 are self-employed.

Educational Attainment

Approximately 46% of Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV metropolitan area have earned a bachelor's degree or higher, which is similar to that of all other immigrants in the metro area (45%). However, all other immigrants in the DMV area are three times more likely to have not completed high school (20%), compared to Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV area (6%). Importantly, Ghanaian immigrants in the DMV metro area tend to be more proficient in English (82%) compared to all other immigrants in the DMV metro area (60%).

Occupation

The top three occupations for Ghanaian-born immigrants in the DMV metropolitan area are Service Occupations; Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations; and Management, Business, and Financial Occupations. Comparatively, Service Occupations are also the number one occupational group for all other immigrants in the DMV metro area (22%). Management, Business, and Financial Occupations (16%) and Computer, Engineering, and Science Occupations (13%) rank as the 2nd and 3rd most popular occupational groups for all other immigrants in the area, respectively.

For factsheets that examine populations at the household level, please note that a household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit. A native-born U.S. citizen household is defined as a household which is headed by a native-born U.S. citizen, regardless of the immigration status of the spouse. Conversely, an immigrant-headed household is defined as a household which is headed by a foreign-born individual, regardless of the immigration status of the spouse. For fact sheets that examine total household income, please note that the total annual income of all members in the household is included in the analysis. For fact sheets that examine personal income, personal income refers to total personal income earned on an annual basis.

For fact sheets that examine poverty status, please note that it excludes individuals who live in group quarters and those who are under the age of 18 with no family.
