I. Important

The basic four-year plans above cover the bachelor of science requirements for business with a concentration in finance at George Mason University. Please be aware that <u>course scheduling at George</u> Mason University Korea is heavily influenced by the four-year plans above.

Please also be aware that the schedules for the Fairfax semesters are generally dependent on completing the coursework listed in the preceding Songdo semesters. Failing to complete a course may have a significant impact on your ability to take some courses. Thus, students are required to submit a Transition Application to Fairfax form. Your academic advisor must review and approve your coursework prior to studying at Fairfax.

For the reasons stated above, you are strongly recommended to speak with your academic advisor if you wish to modify your four-year plan. Deviating from the four-year plan without consulting your academic advisor may leave you with conflicting courses. The four-year plans are subject to change. II. Degree Notes

- A. Business students must take at least seven credits of Natural Science (i.e., one four-credit lab course and one three-credit non-lab course).
- B. 120 credits are required for graduation, with at least 45 of those credits coming from upper-level courses (i.e., 300- or 400-level courses).
- C. Students interested in declaring a second major or a minor must first speak with an academic advisor from the respective department/s.
- D. Please be aware that the Fairfax capstone course BUS 498 requires first completing the following Korea campus courses (see https://catalog.gmu.edu/search/?search=bus+498 for all options): ACCT 303, BULE 303, FNAN 303, MGMT 303, MIS 303, MKTG 303, OSCM 303, and BUS 310. You must be a senior (i.e., 90 or more credits) to take BUS 498, and it must be satisfactorily completed before returning to the Korea campus. The Korea campus will not offer BUS 498.
- E. Business students who do not earn a C or higher in three attempts of School of Business Foundations and Core courses will be terminated from the School of Business. Students terminated from the School of Business are prohibited from enrolling in any School of Business course and will not be eligible to receive a degree from the School of Business.
