

2024 James Buchanan Essay Contest

The Economics Department is sponsoring the James Buchanan Essay Contest with a first-place award of \$500 and a second-place award of \$250. This contest is open to all undergraduate economics students (major and minor). Prior award winners are ineligible for this contest. To enter this contest, students must write an economics essay discussing the topic:

James Buchanan referred to himself, countless times, as a "little d democrat." He believed that the people have an absolute right to govern themselves as they see fit. Yet Buchanan also devoted enormous amounts of effort and ink to explaining the importance of constitutional restraints upon the power even of democratically elected governments.

Some people insist that constitutional restraints on the powers of democratically elected governments put "democracy in chains" — and, hence, are undemocratic. Buchanan, in contrast, argued that genuine democracy requires that it be constrained by constitutional rules. What is Buchanan's argument, and why is it valid — or, perhaps, invalid?

Please include the following in your essay:

- Name, G Number, and email address on the top right of the first page, include your name on each subsequent page
- Times New Roman 12-point font
- 2,500 words
- Submit 1 copy of the essay. Essays will be evaluated for cogency, economic reasoning, and persuasiveness.

- Essay files must be submitted in the following format:
