3. A minimum of 30 credit hours MUST be completed at GMU, which MUST include 12 credits within the major.
4. A minimum of 45 credit hours of Upper Level (300 to 499) course work must be completed.
5. **PHED101-200, 202-299, 380-389; PRLS101-209, 211-299; and MLSC 100-399** courses **cannot** be used towards a degree in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences.
6. A minimum of 120 credits is required for graduation, with a minimum GPA of 2.0
