Course Objective: To develop a working conceptualization and knowledge of psychopathology

Grading Policy: Grades will be determined by *five (5) equally weighted components*: 1) two (2) Regular Exam Grades, 2) the Final Exam Grade, 3) a Term Paper, and 4) Class Participation. - Regular Class Exams: The two (2) Regular Class Exams are scheduled and noted in this syllabus. These exams will
 cover all reading assignments and class discussions to date, but will focus on the preceding segment's material; the exam
 format will be multiple choice and essay questions. Unless there are truly extraordinary circumstances (legitimate
 compelling documentation required), no make-up exams will be given.
- 2. <u>Final Exam:</u> The Final Exam is scheduled for Tuesday 05/07/2024 from1:30 to 4:15 PM. This exam will be cumulative and will cover all class reading materials and discussions; format will be multiple choice and essay questions. University policy regarding Final Exams applies.
- 3. <u>Term Paper:</u> This class requires an original (<u>not</u> recycled), <u>scholarly</u> term paper on a topic pertaining to some aspect of Psychopathology. Term paper topics must be selected, proposed, and <u>approved by the instructor</u> no later than Tuesday 02/29/2024. Term papers must be at least eight (8) double-spaced typed pages (of text) and include at least five (5) <u>quality</u> references. With <u>no</u> exceptions, both a printed hard copy <u>and</u> an electronic/digital file copy (attach ".docx" or ".pdf" file format to jhawley@gmu.edu) of the term paper must be in the possession of the instructor no later than 1:30 PM Tuesday 04/09/2024 of the scheduled PSYC 325-002 class (early completion and submission is appreciated). If you are not in class and participating, you are not learning the material.
