This is entirely an **online course** taught by Alex Tabarrok (and Tyler Cowen) based on their book *Modern Principles of Economics: Microeconomics*. We think this is the best online course in principles of economics ever offered. The course is video based. Every video is followed by questions. Every week there is homework and a test. Lecture time is less and **active learning** time is **more**. Active learning requires more from the student so be prepared the class will move quickly. There will also be opportunities to ask questions of the instructors and TAs.

Needed: In order to take this course you **must purchase access to the Achieve homework system** which gives access to the e-book, practice questions, homework and tests. You can get access for one term for \$114.99 or \$139 if you would also like to rent a paperback textbook. The paperback textbook is useful but not mandatory. The Achieve system has access to the e-book. You purchase Achieve through Blackboard.

You must sign up using your GMU EMAIL and must access Achieve through Blackboard--this will keep your GMU and Achieve accounts linked. Once you have gone to the Blackboard Home Page got to Home Page Achieve on the left panel and then ACHIEVE and then View by Assignments then start the assignments. Blackboard is only used to access Achieve. All class materials including homework and exams etc. are on Achieve. Grades on Achieve are definitive, Blackboard grades take time to sync are should be mostly ignored.

Technical Support

If you have trouble accessing the Achieve system, try the usual procedures of using a different browser, updating your browser, clearing the cache etc. If that doesn't work, **contact Achieve Support**.

Use your **GMU email** to sign up for the class and monitor your **GMU email** for periodic announcements.

Grading

At the end of each **video**, there are homework questions. On these questions, you get unlimited attempts, but you lose 25% for each incorrect attempt. For each chapter there is also a Learning Curve. You can answer as many **Learning Curve** questions as you want to get up to a set number of points. Each section also has an assessment section that is a combination of **Discovering Date**, **Work It Out** and **News Analysis** questions (not every chapter has all categories). You also get multiple attempts at these questions with a 5% penalty for each incorrect attempt. Each chapter concludes with a **Chapter Test**. Finally, there is a **Midterm** and a **Final**. Grades will be calculated as follows:

Your numerical grade will be a good guide to your standing in the class but I reserve the right to adjust (bell) the final grade.

Class Structure and Due Dates

It is very important that you submit your homework and tests BEFORE the due date. All time are EST! If your computer breaks down or if you lose internet access and cannot submit your work you get **ZERO**.

You will have plenty of opportunity to get your work done on time. We will work according to the schedule below and **you will be able to work one week ahead if you choose**. You have flexibility when you do your work, but it is your job to get everything done on time.

Also, your lowest Chapter Test, Video Assignment and (one of) Discovering Data, Work It Out and News Analysis will be **dropped**. This policy is **INSTEAD** of you asking me to change a due date if you were sick, forgetful or had a family emergency. Everyone gets the same opportunity to miss a little bit of work and still catch up. Note that it is never in your interest to miss work. As noted above, you also have the opportunity to work ahead by one week.

The rhythm of the class is that you have all week to finish assignments which are due Sunday night at midnight. But there are exceptions. Do not leave all your work till Sunday night as that will lead to **disaster**.
