#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Elementary Korean 1 covers basic grammatical structures and vocabulary necessary for entry-level conversation, reading comprehension, and writing so that students can build a solid foundation for further study in the Korean language and Korean studies. The course also provides useful information on culture, history, and daily life in Korea, whenever pertinent topics are introduced. The course aims for students to achieve the ability to maintain simple face-to-face conversations by asking and answering simple questions in Korean (speaking), understanding the main segments of the textbook and covered materials in audio sound (listening), writing simple sentences (writing), and comprehend simple sentences in written texts (reading).

## **LEARNING GOAL**

The Learning Goal of this course is to improve Korean proficiency through learning vocabulary, expressions and grammar which are frequently used in daily life in Korea. Furthermore, students can vastly improve their social-cultural knowledge of Korea.

## STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES (SLO)

A student who successfully completes this course will have the opportunity to:

- 1. understand and carry out a conversation on simple topics of daily life.: This will be evaluated through quizzes, the midterm examination, and the final examination.
- 2. comprehend simple Korean texts and write about their own everyday life at a basic level.: This will be evaluated through in-class writing tasks, the midterm examination, and the final examination.
- 3. understand Korean culture in daily life.: This will be evaluated throughout the course in your individual and collaborative group discussions and various role-plays.
- 4. Formulate and use a Novice high-level speech in accordance with ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines.: This will be evaluated throughout the final examination.

#### A. ATTENDANCE (Required)

Regular attendance and participation in class are critical to success in this course. Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes and arrive on time. Of course, it's best to come to school on time, but it's better to come to class late than to be absent. If a student has a legitimate reason for missing class, please notify the instructor in advance. In the case of extended absences due to illness or other emergencies, please make arrangements with the instructor to make up missed work. Failure to attend class regularly may negatively impact a student's grade and ability to achieve the course objectives.

### B. Class participation

The majority of our class time will be spent doing class activities such as pair conversations, group discussions, role plays, and presentations. Acquiring a second language is not accomplished just by listening to an instructor's explanation. To develop the five skills of one foreign language, listening, speaking, writing, reading, and cultural understanding, students are encouraged to engage actively in every kind of class activity. If you think of this class activity as the best chance of making mistakes, you may receive a high score for class participation.

#### C. TWO ORAL EXAMS

Two oral exams will be given as Midterm/Final tests. Successful completion of the two oral tests is required for everybody. Students must score **70 percent or higher** on both exams. Nobody can get a grade for the course without passing the oral exams. In case no pass is given, you will be given one more opportunity to retry the same assignment. Test materials will be announced in class.

#### D. QUIZZES

Quizzes are given in almost every class. A typical quiz consists of ten to fifteen questions covering simple words, phrases, expressions, conjugations, and, at times, listening comprehension. What each quiz covers will be announced in class prior to scheduled quizzes. Please don't be late for quizzes as they count for the biggest portion of the final grade. Absolutely no make-up will be offered for missed quizzes.

#### E. ASSIGNMENTS

Assignments such as workbook drills, compositions, handouts, and notebook-keeping will be given either regularly or occasionally. A workbook assignment is a regular work that should be submitted whenever we finish one chapter. Late submissions and incompleteness will result in deduction of points. Details on other assignments will be announced in class each time. All assignments should be completed and handed in by the given due dates. Failure to do so or do it on time will result in a lower grade.

## F. Midterm/Final Exam

There will be two lesson tests for the previously covered material, as indicated on the schedule. All exams must be taken during the time specified. No electronic communication devices, such as mobile phones, tablets, laptops, etc., are permitted during the exam, or during the review of the exam. You can only miss regularly scheduled exams with prior approval from the instructor and for reasons allowable under university policy. You will need to provide acceptable, official documentation in advance of the regularly scheduled exam supporting your absence from the exam. Students missing a midterm or final exam without prior approval or for reasons not allowable under university policy will automatically receive a score of "zero" for that exam. There will be no delays, extensions, or make-ups given to students who miss an exam without prior approval or for reasons not allowable under university policy.

#### G. Video Project

Students will present a video-recorded creative skit on a topic of their choice (e.g., Daily life, Introduce yourself.). Detailed descriptions will be given in class and posted on Blackboard.

- 1. Students are expected to come to class fully prepared for class activities. Reading textbooks on the scheduled chapter and previewing vocabulary is needed to enhance students' active engagement with a new concept, grammar, and expression.
- 2. There are no make-up tests or examinations.

The use of a cell phone during an exam for any purpose is considered a violation of the Honor Code.
